International River Prizes awarded

The Thiess International River Prize is the world's most prestigious environmental award for river restoration, management and protection. Winners include the Mersey River (UK), Alexander River (Israel), Sha River (China), Danube River (Europe), and Lake Eyre Basin (Australia).

Twinning Projects

Our Twinning program pairs River Prize champions with communities who benefit from their knowledge and expertise in sustainable river management. This program has achieved outcomes in river basin management, community development, education and WaSH (Water, Sanitation and Health).

24 Scholarships Awarded

The Vera Thiess Fellowship for Women, Ken Thiess Memorial Scholarship for Masters students and the Emerging River Leaders Award have provided 24 students with the opportunity to learn in Australia.
